Tomorrow we will be commemorating ANZAC Day and I expect to see a large number of people attending services in Circular Head. It's always a day to look forward to as we pay our respects to those who have served our country. A reminder that there will be dawn services in Smithton, Stanley and Marrawah at 6am. The main service in Stanley is at 9am, in Smithton at 10.30 and 12.30 in Marrawah. Parades will be held 15 minutes before each service.

Recently our General Manager and I attended a luncheon at Stanley to celebrate the Liberal donation of the model ship SS Orion, which was tragically lost at sea in the Bass Strait in 1908. This model was made by the grandson of Captain Arthur Lloyd, which is now housed at the Stanley Discovery Museum. Relatives of this family attended this event and gave us some interesting information about their family. The Stanley wharf was an important part of our history back in the early 1900s.

Next week a group of eight medical students from the University of Tasmania will visit Circular Head for an immersive placement allowing them to examine rural health. The visit forms part of the state-wide Rural Week program, facilitated annually by the University, which gives second-year medical students an opportunity to experience living and working rurally to gain insight into rural health care services, conditions and needs. They will visit a number of places, including the hospital, Smithton Medical Practice and Emmerton Park.
